We need all your plants you have in bloom this month for our display, so here is what you can do to have your plants included in our display.

- 1. Make a reasonable guess as to which plants will be in bloom that week.
- Determine the full name of the plant(s). See handout at last meeting, and get it/them to Jim Gomes ASAP, preferably by email (jim.gomes@att.net) or US Postal Mail (472 N. Raymond Ave, Pasadena, CA 91103). He can also be reach by phone 626-818-1859. We must have the names by Monday night, Oct 13<sup>th</sup> if at all possible. - 3. Place one of your address labels on each pot so that your Plant(s) can be returned to you. Keep a list of the plants for yourself.
- 4. Bring it (them) to The Huntington, Botanical Bldg. between 10 AM 2 PM on Wednesday, Oct 15<sup>th</sup>, if you cannot bring it/them yourself, please contact Irene Sriboonwong (626-964-4785) or Linda Peterson (626-358-8988) or a nearby member early so they may have the plant(s) by Tuesday, Oct. 14, to bring to the show for you.
- 5. Arrive at the SGVOH display in the Botanical Bldg. promptly at 5 PM on Sunday, Oct. 19<sup>th</sup>, to pick up your plants. If you cannot pick your up, please arrange ahead of time for someone else to do so.

This is 55<sup>th</sup> year of the annual Southland Orchid Show and Sale, and the tenth year that it will be held at the Huntington Library, Art Collections and botanical Gardens located at 1151 Oxford Road, San Marino, CA 91108. It is a great orchid show at a fabulous botanical garden where you will be able to see beautiful displays full of orchids, attend orchid lectures, and visit vendors as well as tour the gardens.

# WE NEED YOUR BLOOMING PLANTS FOR OUR DISPLAY

We are counting on members to show as many plants in our display as we have on our ribbon judging table at the regular meetings. Your plants will be safe with guards at night and they can be reclaimed at 5:00 PM on Sunday.

We know that at this time you do not know which of your plants will be ready for display in the Show, but here is the outline of what we need from you;

- If you want your plant judged, then the name of the plant needs to be given to Jim or Irene before Monday night, Oct. 13<sup>th</sup>. As we approach show time, please give us the information on any plant that you think you <u>might</u> provide. We would rather have information for plants that are not in the display than have you not bring a plant that is in peak bloom because you will miss out having it judged.
- Please start identifying plants as soon as possible that might be ready to show then, begin grooming them, and determining their proper names. <u>To have a plant judged, you need to provide at least two names</u>:
  - 1. The **genus** is the category of plant, names like *Cattleya*, *Cymbidium*, *Epicattleya*, *Iwanagara*, *Miltassia*, or *Odontocidium*.
  - 2. The proper species or grex, names like falcate, Everything Nice, El Hatillo, or tenufolia.
  - 3. If the plant is a **hybrid**, the plant may be given a **cultivar or clonal name**, names like *Carmela, Elegance, Pinta*, or *Susan*. These names are usually in single quotes (sometimes double quotes).
  - 4. Here are some examples of full plant names: Laeliocattleya Peggy Huffman 'Carrousel' or Epicattleya El Hatillo 'Pionta' or Psychopsis papilio, or Phragmipedium bessease.
- As you identify you plant's name, just be sure to copy the <u>complete name</u> from the plant label. Sometimes the label will have other versions of the name (a name x a name). If you are not sure how to write the name of a plant, ask someone.
- Send names of possible plants you may show to Irene Sriboonwong (Irene.la@verizon.net; or 626-964-4785 or Jim Gomes (jim.gomes@att.net; or 626-818-1859
- If you can bring your plants to the Huntington, we need them there between 10 & 12 AM on Wednesday, October 15.
- If you cannot bring your plants at that time, then you can arrange to have them brought by Tuesday, October 14, to the Huntington by another member.
- Be sure to keep a list of the plants you take to the show! If a plant gets misplaced you need to be able to identify the plant that needs to be found!

# How Do I GROOM A PLANT TO BE IN A SHOW?

- Check for 'Critters'; ants, scale, mealy bugs, and eliminate them. (That is why you start early!)
- Stake the flower spike to support a fully open blossom
- Carefully wipe or wash leaves to remove any collected dirt or debris
- Remove is possible, any dried sheaths
- Trim off any injured or drying leaves or pseudo bulbs
- Clean off any debris on mix surface
- Remove kikis as necessary
- Insert pot inside a larger pot if necessary to stabilize the plant (keeping it from tipping over)
- Step back to see what detracts (spider webs?, dirt on pot?, or ?) and remedy
- Label your pots as YOURS. An address label works great

Patricia I. (Pat) Rowland passed away on August 31, 2014 at her home in Garden Grove, CA. Pat was born in Garden Grove on May 15, 1923. Early in Pat's life she was a dry dock machinist for the Long Beach Naval Shipyards in CA during the war years. Pat married Lee Rowland in 1943. She was an avid artist, sculptor, jeweler, and potter making many art pieces, jewelry, and paintings throughout her life. She was still working on drawings and paintings within the last few months. Her and Lee's biggest pas- sion in the past 50-60 years was raising and hybridizing orchids, specifically pioneering the hybridizing of upright miniature cymbidiums. The Patricia Rowland Collection produced many award winning orchids throughout Pat's hybridizing career or through collaboration with others, beginning in 1964. In 2000, Pat placed 2nd for the American Orchid Society Award for

Outstanding Hybrid for a Significant Achievement in Hybridizing. As an America Orchid Society and Cymbidium Society of America accredited orchid judge, Pat participated in orchid judging at judging centers and orchid shows in the United States and abroad. She was one of the founding members of the Orange County Branch of the Cymbidium Society of America, as well as Orange County Orchid Society and Newport Harbor Orchid Society. She was also one of the founders of the Fascination of Orchids Show. The Rowland Collection supported many orchid societies throughout southern California. Although physically frail for many years, Pat's mind was always sharp and active. She will be profoundly missed.

Why are my orchid's leaves wrinkled and leathery?



This orchid has lost its roots, probably due to overwatering, and cannot take up water.

Shriveled leaves indicate a lack of water to plant tissue. The next step is to determine why the plant is not getting sufficient water. First, look at the roots. If they appear a healthy white or green and are plump, and the medium is in good shape, suspect underwatering, especially if the roots are white and the pot is very light. If, on the other hand, the roots are in poor condition, suspect root loss. If the plant has no roots, it cannot take up any water, no matter how much you give it. In this case, the cause may be root loss owing to overwatering or medium deterioration, or a recently repotted and poorly established plant. The immediate solution is to raise humidity in the plants' vicinity to reduce stress on whatever roots there may be, and then deal with whether to repot or to simply wait until the plant establishes in the fresh medium.
